## Honorary Zontian Catherine Hamlin wins 'Alternative Nobel Prize'

IDr Catherine Hamlin has received the 2009 Right Livelihood Award "for her fifty years dedicated to treating obstetric fistula patients, thereby restoring the health, hope and dignity of thousands of Africa's poorest women"<sup>1</sup>. The Award includes a cash donation of EUR 50,000.

Dr Hamlin was made an Honorary Zontian in 1996. The SafeHands for Mothers film 'Fistula Pilgrims', shown at the District 29 Conference in Tours, featured Dr Hamlin and her Fistula Hospital in Ethiopia. On Sunday morning, Susanne von Bassewitz, District Foundation Ambassador, during her presentation on the Zonta International Foundation service project in Liberia, also gave us more insight into Dr Hamlin's reasons for opening the hospital in Addis Ababa. Susanne quoted from Dr Hamlin's book 'The hospital by the River', in which Zonta International's donation to the hospital was graciously acknowledged.

It was during 1959 that Catherine Hamlin came with her husband Reginald to Ethiopia from Australia. They were shocked by what they saw. Experienced obstetricians and gynaecologists they knew about obstetric fistula but had never seen one. This condition occurs in developing countries but has been more or less eliminated in industrialised ones.

Women are treated free of charge at the hospital built by Dr Hamlin and her husband in 1974, and where they pioneered a surgical treatment which now has a success rate of 93%. As the hospital's reputation spread, women travelled long distances in search of a cure. Today regional centres have been established making treatment more accessible, and to prevent the condition happening in the first place a midwifery school provides specialist training. 2,750 women are operated on every year bringing the total treated to over 32,000 women.

## **CEDAW Ratification Effort**

I urge all District 11 Zontians to read the CEDAW Resolution adopted by District 11 at the September Conference in Ft. Lauderdale. The Resolution summarizes the importance of US Ratification of this, the only treaty or Convention to Eliminate All Forms of Discrimination Against Women!

Additional material is posted on the District 11 website under Committees, Advocacy, and CEDAW. This material includes letter templates to members of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, to any U.S. Senator, and a template you can use for your own U.S. Senators. The website also has a document that provides the names and mailing addresses of all members of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee (and an important sub-committee that is charged with focusing on women's issues among other concerns). The documents also tell you how to obtain the mailing address of any U.S. Senator. There are also directions to locating senators' email addresses which enable you to simply copy and paste your message onto the email form and send it to the Senator.

I urge each club to download this material to your club website to make it easier for members to access the information and letter templates.

US Ratification of CEDAW is a major priority for Zonta International because our nation's voice is needed to help address the many forms of discrimination women experience around the world. Unfortunately, sex discrimination and in particular violence against women and girls, human trafficking (especially sex trafficking), and the economic marginalization of women have increased as the world's economy has worsened this past year.

**A few statistics from Zonta International documents describing the 2008-2010 ZISVAW projects illustrate the need for US ratification to support government and non-governmental efforts to eliminate all forms of discrimination against women.**

You might include a few of these facts in your letters to Senators urging ratification of CEDAW to illustrate the types of discrimination women and girls face and why our country's support for CEDAW is needed.

**Egypt:** 56% of women are illiterate; compared to only 33% of men. Domestic violence is rampant and pervasive cultural beliefs about the rights of husbands over their wives are such that 70% of women surveyed believed a man is justified in beating his wife if she talks back to him or refuses sex; 65% believed talking with another man justified being beaten; 26% felt the same about burning dinner.

**Syria:** Family honor is taken so seriously, that the media did not report statistics of so-called "honor killings," though nearly 300 were committed each year!

We are all familiar with the reports of mass rapes of women and girls in war-torn countries across Africa; and of Afghan and Pakistani girls having acid thrown into their faces simply because they attended school.

CEDAW is the latest of a series of International Human Rights Treaties intended to eliminate discrimination against persons because of race, religion, and ethnicity.

**It is the only treaty to specifically address the human rights of women!**

Ratification of CEDAW by the United States by mid-December, 2009, the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of UN adoption of CEDAW, is THE major goal of the Zonta International UN and Legislative Awareness and Advocacy Committees.

It is particularly timely to send our letters or emails to Senators NOW as the important UN-supported effort to combat Gender violence, **16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence, November 25-December 10, 2009**, is fast approaching.

Remember: Keep track of the time you spend preparing to send your letters or emails, and sending them and report your time to your club Service Committee to earn Advocacy service hours.

I urge club presidents to please let me know if some in your club participated in the CEDAW ratification effort – and the hours they spent doing so, so I can include a summary of the efforts of District 11 clubs in my report to Zonta International LAA and UN chairs.

## Re-Zontafied in Fort Lauderdale Penny J. Gilmer

I attended my first District 11 Conference in Birmingham, AL in 1991. I went by myself as the first club member to go in a number of years. Other Zontians were amazed to see a member from our club. However, the Zonta Club of Columbia, SC took me into their group for the conference, so I made some instant friends. At the close of the "First Timer" session, the session leader said, "You are Zontafied." I've remember this phrase every since then.

One of the pleasures of being a Zontian is attending the District 11 conferences and the International conventions. During the last weekend in October 2009, I had the pleasure of riding to Ft. Lauderdale with our own Zontian Jean Bryant (Chair of the District 11 Committee, Legislative Awareness & Advocacy), in her new car, and with two District 11 award winners: Holly Annaliese Spencer (District 11 recipient of the Jane M. Klausman Award, nominated by our club, and now in her senior year at FSU), and Madison Marks (District 11 recipient of the Young Woman in Public Affairs, nominated by the Zonta Club of Jacksonville—Madison simultaneously earned her high school degree and AA degree in Spring 2009 and is now an FSU student). These two women epitomize my hope for the future of our country and the world. Hearing them talk about their current activities and the goals for the future was exhilarating. I am mentoring both of them now at FSU.

By selling our new Zonta rose pins at the Zonta store/raffle, we were able to tell Zontians from other clubs about our new Zonta Mammogram Project. We sold every rose pin that we had remaining. I actually sold my own rose pin, as our Zonta International Foundation Ambassador, Doris Larson, as she wanted one when all others were sold. The Zontians from the Bahamas were particularly interested in our mammogram project as they have a growing problem of breast cancer in women in their communities.

One workshop with which I resonated was one given by Zontian Rosa Naccarato, the Immediate Past Chair of the Miami Dade Commission for Women. The title of the workshop, "Creating Freedoms for All," had five major points:

1. Rosa asked, "How do we use equity to bring equality?" Here she addressed the need to support women in public office whose goals support women. She encouraged us to support these women's political campaigns.
2. Rosa emphasized the importance of the USA passing the ERA, and referred to the Web site: <http://4ERA.org>. More than 35 years ago, President Ford said, "In this Land of the Free, it is right, and by nature it ought to be, that all men and all women are equal before the law."
3. Rosa, a Democrat, urged us to support Alex Sink for Florida Governor in the next election. She referred to Ruth's List Florida, where citizens can support women Democratic candidates for political office. See this URL: <http://www.ruthslistfl.org/>
4. Rosa is passionate about supporting at-risk young women that had some trouble with the law and who need understanding and support while engaging in learning while being mentored. She mentioned the PACE Center for Girls, which our club has supported for a number of years.
5. Rosa said that we need freedom to take care of our own health. By taking care of ourselves, we take care of our family too!

I met many Zontians who were first times at the conference. One first timer, in particular, said that she had been a Zontian for five years but had not seen the broad scope of Zonta until attending this conference. She experienced the world-wide service and advocacy approach of Zonta International.

I urge you to attend the next Zonta District 11 Conference in Savannah, GA in late September-early October 2010 (see this URL: <http://www.zontasavannah.com/2010>). Also the International Convention will be in San Antonio, Texas from **June 25-30th 2010** (see this URL: <http://www.zonta2010.org/>). **We will also have our Area 4 Meeting in Ocala late next spring, probably in May 2010. Roxane Dow, a member of our club, is the Area 4 Director, and she will organize the Area 4 meeting with the Zonta Club of Ocala Club.**

## Focusing on Zonta Clubs

### YW Playground Blossoms



The four-year-olds in YWCA teacher Toni Brown’s classroom spent their summer tending to a beautiful new butterfly garden in the YW playground space. Brown, who has worked in the YW’s nationally accredited child care facility since 2008, teaches in the Alabama Office of School Readiness (OSR) classroom.

The mission of the OSR is to provide effective, high quality early childhood experiences that prepare Alabama’s children for school success and lifelong learning, and they strive to ensure that these experiences are available to all of Alabama’s children. As summer arrived, Brown wanted to enrich her classroom activities by teaching her students to be good stewards of the environment. After much research on the sun, soil and shadows in the garden space, Brown decided that the children would create a butterfly garden.

The work began as the children helped to clear the smaller plants and weeds from the existing garden plot. Then they planted marigold seeds in small peat pots and carefully tended to the plants by misting them with water every day. The children were amazed when tiny leaves began emerging from the soil and could not wait until the plants were large enough to transplant to the garden. Brown also purchased plants from a local nursery that had two caterpillars on them. Her class watched the progress of the caterpillars as they built chrysalises and emerged from their cocoons as beautiful butterflies. After the marigolds were transferred, sunflowers, zinnias and a butterfly bush were planted. The garden was completed with a rock pathway in the shape of a “Y” and produced beautiful blooms throughout the summer.

This project would not have been possible without the help of the Zonta Club of Birmingham, who provided the plants, seeds and tools needed to create the garden. We would like to extend a big YW thank you to the Zonta Club and all of its members as well as our dedicated child care staff.
