What happens when a Zontian transfers? Alice Chick, District 11 Treasurer

There have been questions what happens when a Zontian transfers from one club to another within District 11 or to another District. At the 2008 Zonta International Convention – Rotterdam there was a bylaw change in the process.

You can find the bylaw in the Governing documents 2008 page 35 Article XIV ~ Section 2 item (e):

Transfer Privileges. *“A member who moves to the geographical location of another Zonta club may transfer membership to that club, provided the required dues have been paid.”*

This means that if a Zontian is in good standing with their dues paid to Zonta International and to their current District they may transfer without a Club voting upon accepting them into the Club, paying Club dues or a portion of the year based upon the policy of the Club that they are transferring too.

If a Zontian transfers within District 11 from one Club to another there is no money due to District 11. If a Zontian transfers from a different District to District 11 they will be required to pay \$20.00 if the transfer occurs between June 1st and November 30th or \$10.00 if the transfer occurs between December 1st and May 31st.

Zonta Clubs and Zonta Clubs as a Foundation What filings do our Clubs need to do? Alice Chick, District 11 Treasurer

The Zonta year is coming to a close on May 31st and all U.S. Clubs that are not foundations must either report their information to Zonta International (ZI) by August, 2010 if they qualify, file a 990 form with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) before October 15, 2010, or file the 990-N online before October 15, 2010.

How do I determine which one I have to do?

If your clubs revenues are \$25,000 or greater you can either submit your information to ZI headquarters or file directly with the IRS on a 990 or 990EZ form.

If your clubs revenues are less than \$25,000 you are required to file with the IRS the 990-N online each year by October 15th.

After I file what else do I need to do?


If you submit your information to ZI or file the 990 directly with IRS, all you do is to notify the District 11 Treasurer at treasurer@zonta-district11.org to that fact.

If you file the 990-N when you receive your IRS acknowledgement email, it must be emailed to the District 11 Treasurer at treasurer@zonta-district11.org.

What happens if we do not file?

Each Zonta Club in the United States chartered by ZI headquarters is considered to be a civic organization and is exempt from United States federal income taxes under the IRS code IRC 501(c)(4) rules. If a club does not file for 3 consecutive years the IRS will revoke your 501(c)(4) status and ZI will be required and mandated to disband your Club. In order to prevent this from happening to your Club **you must** file.

If your Club is or has a foundation 501(c)(3) you must still follow the reporting requirements except that **you cannot** be included in the ZI headquarters filing. You must either file the 990 or 990EZ directly with the IRS or file online the 990-N depending whether the revenue is greater than or less than \$25,000.

Business & Professional Women of Tallahassee and the Zonta Club of Tallahassee recently teamed up to collect new twin sheet and towel sets for the women and children who seek shelter at the Refuge House. Bed Bath & Hope is a three-year project sponsored by Zonta in partnership with other local organizations. Each year hundreds of local women escape domestic abuse, and seek shelter for themselves and their children at Refuge House.

At a unique event called "Sip n' Shop," members met at a local restaurant for dinner, then went as a group to purchase sheets and towels. Together with collections from monthly meetings, equaled 24 new sheet sets and 10 new towel sets. BPW President Christy Crump presented Zonta President Pam Ridley with the collected items March 22.

BPW's next exciting project upcoming is the 2010 Women's Conference. Entitled "Live Beyond Existence," this full day, engaging conference and networking opportunity will take place at the Leon County Civic Center from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and includes a robust range of topics including Wellness and Anti-Aging Medicine, the Tallahassee Economy, Women's finances, the role of Empowering Women through Political Education, Steps to a Building Profitable Small Business, Professional Speaking that Connects, Tallahassee women who are living beyond existence, Diversity, Living your Authentic Life, Genuine Networking, and Options for our Aging Population.

BPW's mission is to achieve equity for all women in the workplace through advocacy, education and information. "We are proud to partner with another organization that focuses on issues important to women in the Tallahassee community," said Crump.
