


Town Hall Meeting

President Vickie Jackson and Susan Shedd Newbold represented ZCOGM at a town hall meeting which was facilitated by the Zonta Club of Miami Lakes on October 11, 2023. Speakers from Miami Dade County Police and the State Attorney's office informed the attendees about the prevalence of human trafficking in Miami-Dade County. There was also a personal testimony from a survivor. The club members walked away inspired to inform the public about this very important matter!







Stomp Out Sickle Cell

Zonta Club of Greater Miami donated funds to the 8th Annual Stomp Out Sickle Cell 5K Run/Walk in support of a young single mother of three (3) children who suffers from the disease, which commonly affects people of African, Mediterranean and Mid-Eastern descent. \$250 was donated for the cause.



Standing Against Human Trafficking

Zonta Club of Greater Miami created two informational displays on November 18, 2023 to inform the public about human trafficking, what it is, how prevalent it is, how to recognize it, how to report it, and how to get help. Handouts and informational postcards were made available for the general public. The displays will be on site from mid-November through the end of December. Special thanks to ZCOGM member and Miami-Dade County Public Library Manager, Michele Stiles, for facilitating the annual display over the years and for the use of the conference room for meetings!



Zonta Says No

Zonta Club of Greater Miami held the Zonta Says No Walkathon on December 2nd, 2023 at Wilbur Bell Park in Perrine, Florida. Approximately 30 people were in attendance. In addition to walking, attendees were given a short talk and written information regarding Human Trafficking by ZCOGM President and Past Chair of the Criminal Justice Committee for the Community Relations Board for Miami-Dade County, Vickie Jackson, and a Domestic Violence overview by ZCOGM member and Director of the SafeSpace South Domestic Violence Shelter for Miami-Dade County, Sonie Beliard. Funds were raised to fund scholarships and future service projects. High school volunteers earned community service credit. Community Councilman Wilbur Bell, Zonta Immediate Past President, Angela Chin, of CORE Community Services, and Vickie Jackson of PollyCo Realty, Inc. sponsored the event.

Club members participated in the Pink Walk which is held every year by the Women's Breast and Heart Initiative to help fight Breast and Heart Disease in Women. Fifteen members participated in the walk.



The Club's big event this year was the Human Trafficking Seminar sponsored by the Zonta Club of Miami Lakes in conjunction with

the Florida State Attorney's Office. The Human Trafficking Unit provides a very informative presentation on what is happening to girls in our communities. There were fifty people in attendance. Members collected items for the girls such as toiletries, clothes, gift cards, and other personal items. When the flier was circulated on social media the response to donate was over the top.





November Club Updates

The Club participated in the Veteran's Day Parade held in the town of Miami Lakes. Members walked with the Club banner and gave out beads and candy to the children on the parade route, which was fun for all involved. During the parade the club was recognized for its achievements.



On November 14th the club received a Proclamation from the Town of Miami Lakes, signed by the Mayor, Manny Cid. The Club received this honor from the community for their outstanding work to improve the lives of women and girls.



The 16 days of Activism is being recognized by the Town of Miami Lakes and the community.

For the 16 days of activism the Club took the following action:

- Flyers placed in the Miami Lakes Library to educate people on stopping violence for women and children.
- Placing flyers in the Town of Miami Lakes City Hall where there is a lot of traffic there on a daily basis.
- Placing the Club's roller banner in a boutique owned by a member which is on Main Street another area highly known for a lot of foot traffic.
- The Club flier was emailed to each member asking them to send out five of the flyers to their friends and family to increase awareness.



Four Club members attended a meet and greet occasion for the newly appointed Vice Mayor, Miriam Yanes. This led to the Mayor inviting members to attend and inform the Vice Mayor about the club and their activities in the town. It was a very informative and positive experience for the members.



December Club Updates

In December the Zonta Club of Miami Lakes does not hold a general meeting, but they planned a social for December 2nd where everyone brings a dish. It's a good way for the new members to become familiar with all the members and it's always a lot of fun, dancing, and lots of wine.

The Club will have two events in December: each year they buy Christmas Stockings and fill them up with all kinds of goodies for PACE School for Girls (high school students). Also, a new member volunteers her time with Florida State University and its Young Parents Project. These are teen girls with babies or who are pregnant that have been entered into the Project by the Juvenile Court. The Club has been asked to donate gift cards for these young mothers and mothers to be.


ZCNP Talks About Healthy Relationships

In a specially convened seminar for Grades 4, 5, and 6, members of the ZCNP addressed the Albury Sayles Primary School girls on "Healthy Relationships." The young girls were told that a healthy relationship does not always mean happiness but that the association should be positive and mutually respectful overall. They were warned to be on the lookout for the traits of possessiveness, isolation, invasion of privacy, controlling, cruel or abusive behavior, threats of violence, property destruction, and ignoring, belittling, and pressuring behavior – all of which the presenters identified as signs of an unhealthy relationship.

Russell and Madlene transferred from the ZC of Nassau and sponsored, organized and mentored (SOM) the 31 chartered members of the new club. Winnie was also a charter member of the club.

This is an event that club members look forward to as they get to see fellow Zontians (old friends) from other clubs and meet new Zontians. Marisa Mason-Smith represented the ZCNP and participated in the Mass by reading the scripture. The service was a time to reflect on the UN and the world, and to aspire for a world that Zontians want to see with a spirit of determination to heal divisions, repair relationships, and build peace, leaving no one behind.



PINK OCTOBER

The ZCNP held its first Pink Mammogram Party this October for members, friends of Zonta and the wider community, in partnership with a local medical facility, to promote the importance of early detection of breast cancer.

On the heels of alarmingly high cases of breast cancer in the country, ZCNP recognized the need to remove fear around the process of mammograms through sisterhood bonding and by encouraging inclusivity for all women to be involved. The club also funded 3D mammograms for women in the disabled community, including amputees and the visually and hearing impaired. The atmosphere was a supportive, jovial one, with women coming together to have a pink party, with games, discussions, and treats.

Zonta Says No - 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence

Zonta Club of Tortola once again 'oranged' the British Virgin Islands (B.V.I.) as part of the global campaign: 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence. Zonta Club of Tortola joined forces with local groups Unite BVI Foundation, Girl Up, F.E.M.A.L.E., WIN British Virgin Islands, the Royal Virgin Islands Police Force and others to participate in various activities on Tortola and Virgin Gorda. This included interviews with community leaders and a keynote address by special guest, Ms. Ronelle King, a Multi-Award-Winning Gender Rights Activist. Ms. King, who visited the B.V.I. from Barbados, founded Life In Leggings: Caribbean Alliance Against gender-based Violence to eradicate regional occurrences of gender-based violence.

The activities culminated in a march throughout the capital, Road Town on Saturday December 9th. While the Enis Adams Drum Corps led the way, various groups carried placards and banners and chanted "Say No to Violence against Women and Girls!". The public was encouraged to take a stand against gender-based Violence.

Throughout the 16 Days of Activism, Zontians could be seen hanging banners and decorating trees with orange bows and signs throughout Road Town. Zontians also shared Facebook posts with tips on how the public could support women and girls who suffer from gender-based violence. Radio ads illustrated the real-life conversations which take place regarding domestic and gender-based violence and let the community know where to seek help.
